## Main Activity and Expected Result

## Consolidation of Haiti's Multi-Hazard Early Warning System (MHEWS)

Highly qualified technical expertise is being provided to define the delivery of the MHEWS, develop Standard Operating Procedures, and design the strategy for EWS production, dissemination, and communication.

Expected Result:

• Enhanced institutional preparedness and response capacity, especially regarding improved Haiti's emergency infrastructure.

## Partnerships and Coordination

The World Bank implements this project in close collaboration with the DGPC within the Ministry of Interior and Local Authorities, the Ministry of Public Works, the Haiti Hydrometeorological Unit within the Ministry of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Rural Development, the Ministry of National Education and Vocational Training, the Ministry of Economy and Finance, and the National Centre for Geospatial Information. The World Bank coordinates its efforts with the EU Delegation in Haiti.

Progress is closely aligned with the implementation of the World Bank-financed <u>Strengthening Disaster</u> <u>Risk Management and Climate Resilience Project</u>.
