Haitian citizens and households bear the brunt of this impact, with vulnerable households being disproportionately affected. While some foundational elements of an adaptive social protection (ASP) system are established, continued technical support is necessary to ensure sustainability of an effective ASP system.</p> <p>The objective of this technical assistance is to strengthen the Government's emergency preparedness and response capacity through improved financing and disbursement mechanisms, particularly by leveraging social protection (SP) mechanisms.</p>
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Main Activities and Expected Results

Support effective financial planning for social protection disaster-related expenditures

This component offers technical assistance and policy recommendations to operationalize the recently adopted Disaster Risk Financing Strategy. Actions include a diagnostic of risk financing instruments to assess their strengths and weaknesses and identify and establish synergies with social safety nets.

Expected Results:

- Consolidated financing mechanisms allowing for rapid disbursements at scale.
- Emergency response resources able to be delivered via social assistance platforms.

Improve hazards and households' vulnerability analysis tools and protocols

This activity provides critical technical support to improve and integrate existing vulnerability assessments, disaster response targeting tools, and field delivery protocols across government services and agencies.

Expected Results:

- Improved adequacy and targeting of emergency preparedness and response interventions.
- Strengthened government management and coordination capacities regarding early warning, preparedness, and response.

Partnerships and Coordination
