National Sustainable Development Plan 2030 (A Medium-Long Term Plan)

- Plan 2030 is still under construction and the SDG's will be mainstreamed within this plan.
- Plan 2030's proposed theme is : “A caring society”
- Plan 2030 proposed main pillars:
 - I. Governance
 - II. A competitive private sector Infrastructure
 - III. Environment and ecology Innovation Climate change and disaster management



Process to integrate SDGs in the Development Plan 2030

→ Participatory and consultative process involving:

- Policy Makers-Parliamentarians & Ministers
- Main opposition political parties
- Senior Public Servants
(Permanent Secretaries & department heads)
- The Private Sector Leaders
- The Social Partners
- Technical Working Group & Steering Committee of Plan 2030



Process to consider the Paris Agreement in public policy (NAP)

- **Participatory and consultative process for NAP development;**
 - The Process was launched in 2015 and engaged a broad cross section of stakeholders including Private Sector, Public Sector, and Non-state actors.
 - The process was guided by the 2012 UNFCCC 'Technical guidelines for the national adaptation plan process'.

NAP Objectives are:

1. Enhancing institutional framework
2. Building coastal resilience
3. Improve water resource management
4. Building the resilience of communities



Mechanism for implementation

- A sub-committee comprising members of several institutions is tasked with mainstreaming the SDG's within plan 2030.
- All projects entering the PSIP has to be screened to ensure sufficient conformity to the Plan 2030 , NAP etc.
- This screening process is mandated by law (Public Finance Management Act, and its Regulations Section 33)



Next steps

- Adoption of the plan in a partisan manner
- Seek finance from development partners
- Our budgetary process has been strengthened, however resources mobilization still a critical issue.
