

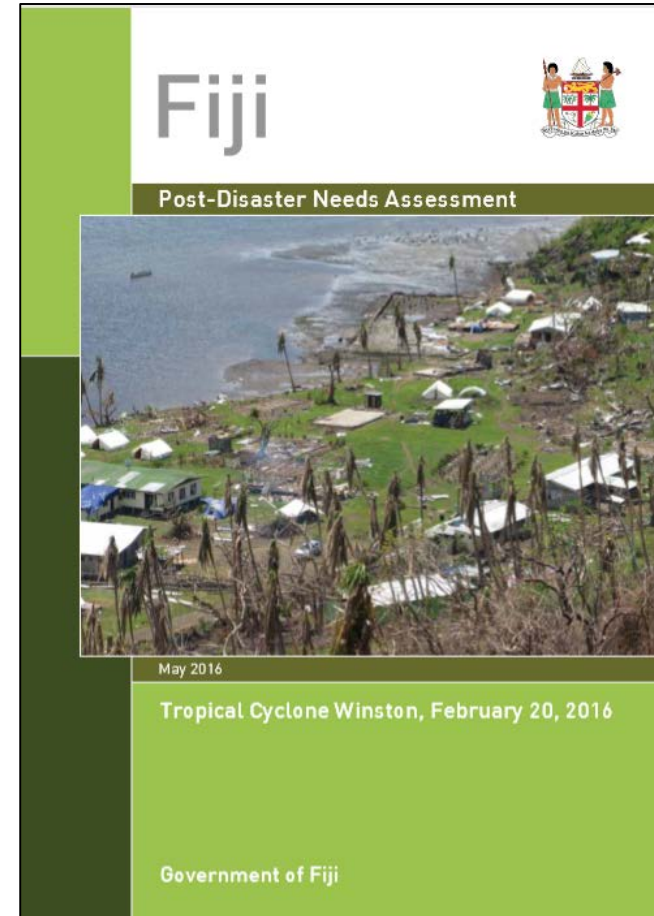

- Affected Population
540,400 or 62%
- Displacement and
Relocation Consideration



Ensuring Inclusion in Fiji

1. Fiji Constitution 2013 – Bill of Rights
(Life, Education, Economic Participation, Children)
2. Disaster Management Act 1998 and Disaster Management Plan 1995
 - Guidance on Recovery Operations
 - Protection of Displaced Persons



Ensuring Inclusion of Displaced Persons in the Recovery Process

1. State Support Covers Displaced Persons
 - (i) Shelter Assistance - Help for Homes
 - (ii) Welfare Assistance - Social Protection
 - (iii) Food Ration Distribution
 - (iv) Superannuation Funds Drawdown

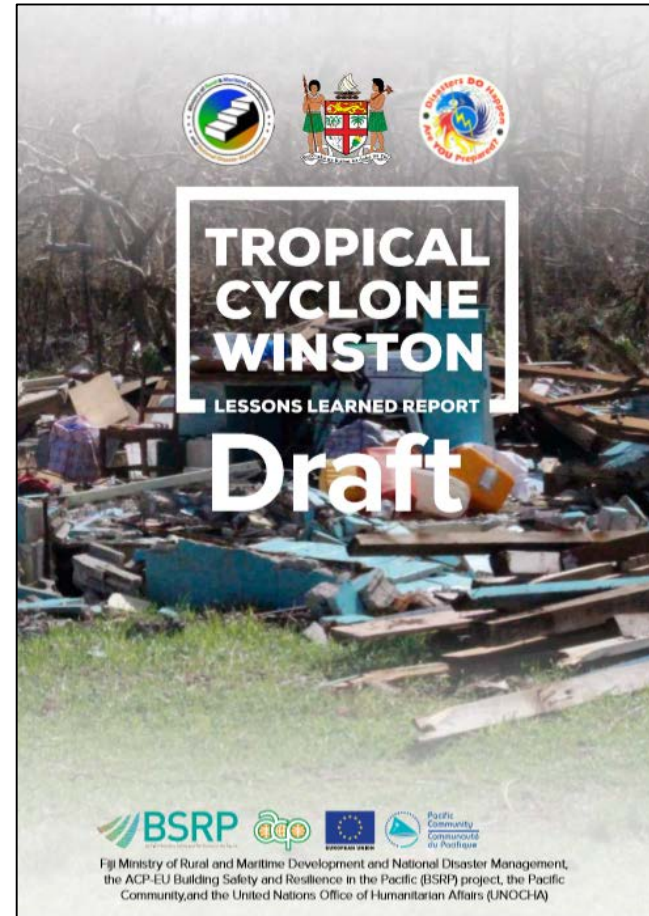
2. Supports Tradition Coping Mechanism
 - Family System
 - Community Structures



Lessons Learned On Supporting Displacement

1. Profiling of Displaced Persons

- Right Persons are Identified
- Continuity of Support and Engagement
- Assess if Support is Well Targeted
- Monitor Progress Overtime to support policy review

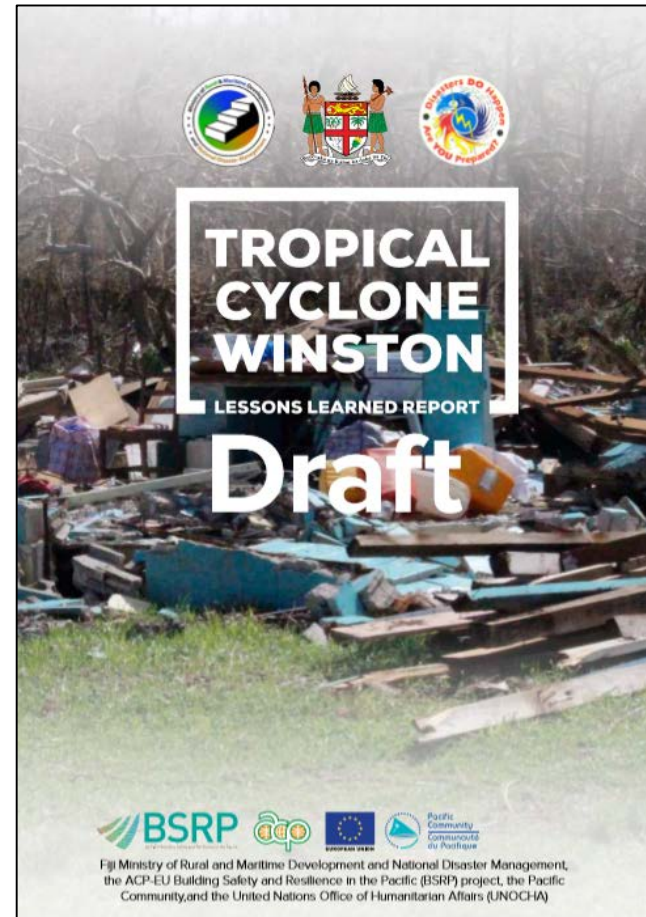


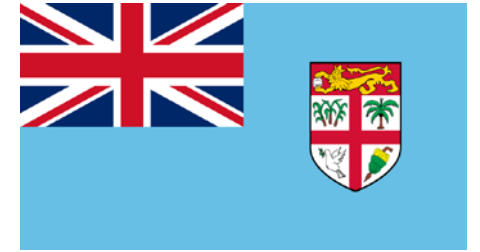
Way Forward
