FINANCIAL PROTECTION

Having the right policies and instruments in place reduces the fiscal impact of disasters. GFDRR has resolved to enable direct and indirect insurance programs that will cover more than 100 million people.

COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

Empowering vulnerable populations reduces poverty & ensures an inclusive, efficient approach to disaster risk management. GFDRR's objective is to reach at least 15 million people through community engagement and social protection.

RESILIENCE TO CLIMATE CHANGE

Climate change could push up to 100 million people into poverty by 2030, with small island developing states particularly exposed to its effects. GFDRR aims to enable at least \$3 billion in climate resilience investments from partners.
